## Major Activities Educational Outings & Exposure Trips

# Major Activities Academic Support & Mentorship









Over 71 after-school tutoring sessions across five months.

15 one-on-one mentoring sessions, helping learners with personal and academic challenges.

14 Netball sessions and friendly matches with Reddam House boosted fitness, teamwork, and confidence.



Organised friendly matches between Reddam House and Future Sparks build sportsmanship and confidence among learners.

# Future Sparks continues to grow in both reach and impact

#### Learners Reached Per Month

- We consistently average 70-75 learners each month
  - Grade 8: 42 to 46 learners (new intake boosted numbers)
  - Grade 9: 10-15 learners
  - Grade 10: 12 19 learners
  - Grade 11: 9 12 learners
  - Grade 12: 8 12 learners

#### **Cumulative Impact**

- Total tutoring sessions (February–June) = 71
- Total one-on-one mentoring sessions = 15
- Total sports sessions = 14

Over 350 individual learner sessions delivered this year so far!
